Group bookings and school visits are available throughout the year

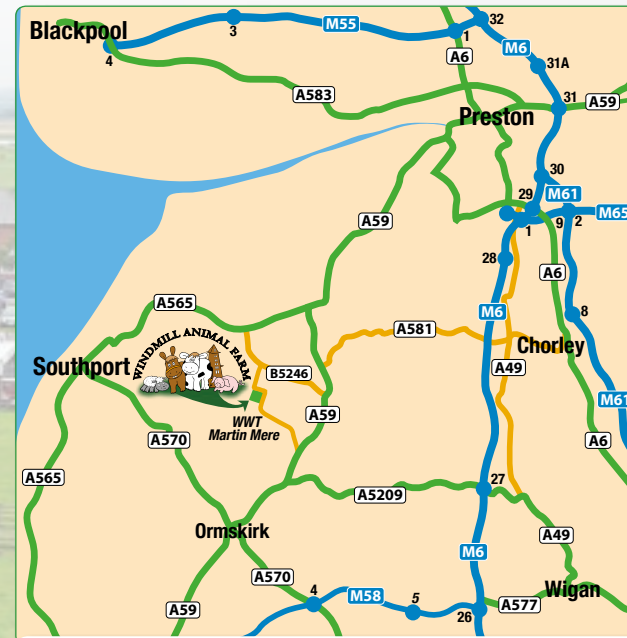
All children must be accompanied by an adult

Windmill Animal Farm – always a great family day out whatever the weather!

Join in the fun and see all the animals at Windmill Animal Farm

Windmill Animal Farm was first opened to the public in 1992, and offers visitors the chance to see the day-to-day running of a working farm whilst having the chance to watch and feed many of the farm animals.



The farm is set within over 100 acres of grounds with over 60 acres open to visitors. At one side of the farm is what used to be a derelict Windmill from which the farm gets its name.

The farm animals have been acquired from many different parts of the world with a mixture of rare breeds ranging from the Scottish Highland Cattle to the Jacob sheep which originate on the mainland of Spain and the rare Valais Blacknose sheep from the slopes of the Austrian mountains. Other animals include; Dexter cattle, Pygmy goats, Shetland ponies, Wallabies, Angora goats, Llamas . . .

Each spring we have several hundred sheep ready to lamb. We open our lambing shed to our visitors so they can see the lambing as it happens and ask questions about the process.



We have regular visits from Critters2You with their collection of spiders, snakes and other reptiles, and Excel Falconry with their hawks, falcons, and owls which can be seen flying for bait.

As well as these beautiful and unusual animals, the farm has a marvellous selection of extensively equipped indoor and outdoor children's play areas.

We have two sizes of John Deere Pedal Tractors plus Go Karts, and Roller Racers which can all be ridden by the children in dedicated play areas.

Unique to the farm is our famous 15" gauge miniature railway which crosses the farm with a track of over one mile in length. Visitors can ride the Farm Train and disembark at the Lake View Station to look at the lovely scenery, relax and have their picnic, whilst the children play safely on the equipment in the play area.



All of the indoor facilities including the giant play barn, the coffee shop and the party rooms are fully heated, so you can enjoy a visit to the farm during Spring, Autumn and in the



days running up to Christmas when you can visit Santa on our farm railway.

Visitors to the farm are able to relax and have something to eat and drink in the coffee shop which has free internet access. There are picnic tables in the Giant Play Barn, outside in the courtyard, and at other locations around the farm. You are able to relax whilst your children play happily and safely.

School parties are welcome to the farm throughout the year, and educational guided tours are available with information on the animals and the chance to see, and learn about the rearing of these animals and their varied needs and lives.



There is disabled access, and our facilities include; toilets with baby changing, several hand washing and wheel washing stations, and we have a large car park with overflow and coach parking, plus an attractive craft and gift shop, so that you can take a memory of the farm home with you.
